Catalyzing Climate Finance: MSMEs Join Forces at Uganda's First Private Sector Forum

Uganda took a significant step toward inclusive climate action with the inaugural National Private Sector Engagement Forum on Climate Finance (NaPSEF1), held at Serena Hotel under the theme "Advancing Private Sector Leadership in Climate Finance Mobilization." The event brought together key players from government, the private sector, financial institutions, and development partners to chart a path toward a more climate-resilient economy.

Representing Uganda's Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), the Uganda Small Scale Industries Association (USSIA) took an active role in the discussions. USSIA reaffirmed its dedication to equipping small-scale industries with access to climate finance mechanisms, while promoting adaptation and resilience strategies across grassroots enterprises.

Public-Private Partnership (PPP) initiatives were a focal point of the forum, with Mr. Jim Mugunga, Executive Director at the Ministry of coordinated Finance. presenting government efforts to bridge policy and practice in climate finance mobilization. Financial institutions such as Uganda Development Bank (UDB), PostBank, Equity Bank. and the Uganda Manufacturers Association (UMA) shared practical insights on green financing initiatives and the role of private capital in driving sustainable development.









Uganda Small Scale Industries Association (USSIA), representing the voice of micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs). USSIA reaffirmed its support for energyefficient industrial practices and emphasized the importance of equipping small-scale manufacturers with knowledge and tools to adopt clean technologies and reduce energy costs.

Discussions at the workshop focused on sector-specific strategies, regulatory frameworks, financing mechanisms, and the need for public awareness campaigns. Participants also explored the role of innovation, technology transfer, and private sector engagement in accelerating energy efficiency adoption.




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Forging Stronger Partnerships for Skills Development in Uganda

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
The most commonly cited challenge across all accessibility. sectors was market Many entrepreneurs struggle to find consistent buyers for their products, especially beyond their immediate communities. Poor infrastructure, lack of transport, limited digital presence, and insufficient marketing skills have further hindered their growth. Several participants also shared that while they can produce in bulk, they often have no clear channels through which to sell or promote their products.


The next steps will include capacity-building workshops, mentorship opportunities, and facilitating access to broader markets—both locally and regionally. By formally onboarding these potential members into the USSIA network, the association hopes to create a more inclusive industrial community that recognizes and nurtures grassroots enterprise.
