Strengthening Peaceful Pathwaysd

Building capacity for peace and conflictsensitive development, the Uganda Small Scale Industries Association (USSIA) actively participated in a four-day "Do No Harm" workshop organized by LEADS. The different workshop brought together stakeholders to deepen their understanding of conflict dynamics, leadership roles, for conflict-sensitive practical approaches programming.

Participants focused on the transfer of resources in conflict contexts and introduced participants to conflict analysis tools, actor and stakeholder mapping, and identifying partners for action and behavior change. The discussions highlighted how resources, when not well managed, can exacerbate conflicts. Participants also practiced generating program options that integrate conflict sensitivity to ensure sustainability.





Participants also delved into conflict-sensitive planning, with detailed discussions on the steps of planning and the use of a risk management matrix. The day also covered conflict-sensitive implementation, highlighting its essential elements, followed by insights on monitoring and evaluation (M&E) practices that ensure projects remain sensitive to the conflict dynamics on the ground. the emphasized Importantly, day incorporation of gendered perspectives into conflict analysis, ensuring that interventions address the unique challenges and contributions of both men and women.

The training created an interactive space where participants learned the step-by-step process of soap production: from mixing ingredients and molding bars to practicing safe production techniques. The sessions emphasized not only the technical know-how but also the potential of soap making as a household necessity and an incomegenerating venture.

What stood out most was the eagerness of participants to turn knowledge into action. By the end of the training, many expressed confidence that they could now produce quality bar soap for both domestic use and commercial purposes. This empowerment opens doors for families to reduce household expenses while also tapping into the growing demand for affordable hygiene products.

The initiative demonstrated how simple, practical skills can transform communities, creating pathways for financial independence and improved standards of living. For the women and youth of Sironko, the training was more than an exercise in soap making—it was a step toward building brighter, self-sustaining futures.
