The grand launch of the Youth Empowerment & Participation in Policy & Development (YEPPAD) project at Sheraton Kampala was nothing short of inspiring, as young innovators showcased their potential to drive Uganda's future. The event brought together brilliant minds from four leading universities Makerere University (MUK), Muni University (MUNI), Uganda Christian University (UCU), and ISBAT University who pitched transformative ideas under the Entrepreneurship Booster Platform.

In a vibrant and competitive atmosphere, each university presented innovations aimed at addressing social and economic challenges through creativity and technology. The highlight of the day was ISBAT University's groundbreaking innovation,





the Kwetu Hub App, which emerged as the winning idea. The app demonstrated a unique approach to creating opportunities for young entrepreneurs, offering a practical solution to bridge gaps in mentorship, networking, and access to resources.

The YEPPAD project launch was more than a competition it was a platform for youth voices to be heard and their ideas amplified in policy and development spaces. By engaging students in problem-solving and enterprise creation, YEPPAD set the tone for a new wave of youth-led innovations that hold promise for transforming communities and shaping inclusive development in Uganda.





The summit unveiled Centenary Bank's innovative financing solutions designed with SMEs in mind—tools that can help business owners move from surviving to thriving. But the real spark came from the keynote delivered by Charles Ocici, Director General of Enterprise Uganda, who challenged entrepreneurs to face reality while embracing possibility.

Ocici painted a candid picture of Uganda's entrepreneurial landscape, highlighting the persistent "missing middle," the short-lived nature of many brands, and the tough truths about loans. Yet, his message was clear: banks are not barriers they are springboards for growth if entrepreneurs know how to use them.

He left business owners with two golden rules to u

- 1. Keep records religiously not for the sake of paperwork, but as the foundation of trust and credibility.
- 2. Turn numbers into knowledge analyse your records, separate personal from business growth, and make decisions backed by evidence.

### Landmark Climate Finance Strategy and Green Taxonomy Unveiled

Kampala's Serena Hotel was transformed into a hub of ambition and innovation on 11th September 2025, as Uganda unveiled a powerful set of tools designed to reimagine its growth story through the lens of sustainability. From government leaders and development partners to private sector trailblazers and civil society champions, the room was united by one mission: to secure Uganda's future through climate-smart finance.

Key tools launched included the National Climate Finance Strategy, the National Green Taxonomy, the National Climate Finance Vehicle, the Country Climate & Development Report, and Guidelines for mainstreaming climate action in the financial sector. Together, these instruments create a framework to align Uganda's financial flows with sustainable development goals while unlocking opportunities for businesses, investors, and communities.

Global partners—including the European Union, World Bank, Denmark, the United Kingdom, and the Global Green Growth Institute (GGGI) pledged continued support to mobilize climate finance, enhance resilience, and accelerate Uganda's tenfold growth agenda through sustainable pathways.

Uganda's leadership was applauded for weaving climate action into national planning, positioning the country as a regional trailblazer in climate finance. For SMEs and industry players, these tools signal new possibilities to innovate, access finance, and thrive in an economy where growth and green ambition go hand in hand.



### Coffee Dealers Engage on WE WORK Project

The session provided a platform for manufacturers to interact directly with a packaging supplier, gaining insights into the latest trends, cost-effective solutions, and standards required for both local and export markets. From bottle designs labels sealing to options. participants explored how packaging can elevate their products and capture consumer attention.
