The Demo Day showcased innovators, investors, and policy experts united by a shared mission—to promote environmentally friendly industrial solutions that balance profitability with sustainability. Attendees experienced a dynamic program featuring startup pitching sessions, a high-level panel discussion on "From Lab to Market," and recognition of outstanding green innovations shaping Uganda's cleaner production landscape.



Steering Sustainable Industrial Growth Through Freezones



A new chapter in Uganda's journey toward sustainable industrialization has begun with the launch of the **National** Steering Committee on the Green Freezones Project, where the Uganda Small Scale Industries Association (USSIA) now holds an influential seat. The committee will oversee the implementation of the project titled "Developing the Capacity of Uganda Freezones Authority to Set Up Export Freezones that Meet Global Green Trade Standards."

The initiative will pilot the development of two model green industrial zones, with Lugazi and Jinja identified as key potential sites. These zones are envisioned to serve as blueprints for sustainable, inclusive, and globally competitive industrial growth.



The inaugural meeting brought together key partners, including the Global Green Growth Institute (GGGI), the Uganda Free Zones and Export Promotion Authority (UFZEPA), TradeMark Africa, and DANIDA.

The project aims to establish eco-friendly export-free that promote zones environmentally responsible industrial development, aligning with global green trade principles. Its focus areas include sustainable site development, environmental and social governance (ESG) compliance, and mobilization of climate finance to support green investments.

Members actively engaged in discussions, seeking clarity on how these tax obligations apply to their various sectors, and how to remain compliant while maintaining business growth. The facilitators emphasized that understanding tax systems is key to building competitiveness, and long-term sustainability for small-scale industries.
